



## Lesson 2 Assignment Instructions: Creating Multimedia Lessons and Materials

1. Determine the content, topic, and objectives of your lesson.
2. Search for related videos, segments, and images using the various *unitedstreaming* search tools.
3. Save videos, segments, and images to a folder on your computer or on a disk. It is a good idea to create a project folder as a single location for all of your resources for a given unit or lesson.
4. Create a lesson plan. You can use the Lesson Plan Template as a guide, or work from an existing lesson plan. Think about how you will use the videos in your lesson.
  - Will you create hyperlinks to videos in your instructional presentation?
  - Will students click on hyperlinks to view videos in a computer lab or at computer stations?
5. Design the instructional materials that will be used by you and the students throughout the lesson (presentation slides, overhead transparencies, posters, handouts, worksheets, etc.)
  - Insert images and clip art
  - Create hyperlinks from text or images to video clips
6. Describe how you will use the instructional materials in your lesson plan.
7. Teach the lesson and reflect on its success. How did the use of *unitedstreaming* resources impact the students' learning?
