What is the Middle School Bee in a Box Regional Competition?

The Middle School Bee in a Box Regional Competition is a civic education program and competition for middle school students sponsored by the Sumners Foundation and Law-Related Education. Students use an online guide to prepare for a two-part competition. This guide can be found at beeinabox.org. The content on the website covers the period of American history from Colonization through Reconstruction.

What are the specifications of the two-part competition?

The written competition is composed of 40 questions from the following categories:

People
Documents
Constitution
Events

The oral competition will require each student to answer one question from each of the following categories:

People
Documents
Constitution
Events

What are the prizes for winning?

First-Place \$100 gift card

Second--\$50 gift card

Third--\$25 gift card

What grade levels are eligible to participate?

Students in grades 6-8

How many students can a teacher register?

The maximum number that can compete at the Middle School Bee in a Box Regional Competition is 50. Therefore, it is recommended that each teacher register a maximum of 3-5 students. However, the regional coordinator can be contacted at the end of registration to determine if a teacher may bring more students.
